Harborough District Council's original Private Sector Renewal Policy was developed in 2003 following implementation of the Regulatory Reform (Housing Assistance)(England and Wales) Order 2002. This provides a general power to provide assistance for housing renewal and gives flexibilities on how this achieved. Mandatory Disabled Facilities Grants were retained in the legislation. Local authorities have responsibility to adopt and publish policy that is based on information on the housing stock and local can be affected by house condition. Changes in legislation relating to disabled facilities and the gene reduction in the level of level of capital receipts over the years has meant that the Council has to look alternative forms of assistance for private sector renewal.
