I'm interested in Extra Care what do I need to do next?

There are a number of Extra Care schemes across Leicestershire where properties can be rented, leased or purchased outright. For information on schemes in the area where you live contact the Advice and Information Service on 0116 222 9555 who will help explain what you need to do next.

How will I know if I am eligible for Extra Care housing?

Leicestershire County Council will arrange a social care assessment with you. This will look at you both your short term and long term needs. We will check your eligibility at the same time as completing the assessment. You must have a minimum need of $3\frac{1}{2}$ hours care per week.

What are the Costs?

Extra Care is designed to be 'affordable housing' with secure tenure and all the legal rights associated with living in your own home.

Costs will include;

- Rent
- Service Charges
- Wellbeing Charge (24/7 cover)
- Care Services

A financial assessment will be undertaken to identify your individual costs and will look at your entitlement to benefits such as Housing Benefit and Income Support.

- · Services include the provision of 24/7 on site staff delivering flexible care and support options, giving you peace of mind that help is available when you need it, helping you to stay independent and in control.

Other benefits and facilities of Extra Care may often include;

- A nutritious cooked meal daily
- Well designed and maintained gardens with outdoor communal areas
- Assisted bathrooms or Spa facilities
- Controlled access to the site with secure main doors
- Alarms (personal/lifelines) situated in your accommodation and in the building

- Alongside the 24/7 provision there is a wide range up to date equipment and technology including gadgets and gizmos that can help you to remain independent in your home and be adapted to meet your needs.
- Extra Care is private living, you have your own front door, but it also offers a real sense of community where there are opportunities to be actively involved in social events.
- Laundry facilities
- · Hairdressing/beautician facilities and/or health treatment rooms
- Dining room/restaurant and coffee bars
- Communal lounges and other areas such as a library room, crafts room or computer suite
