Did you know?

There are believed to be 46,000 pieces of plastic in every square mile of ocean.

Most families throw away about 40kg of plastic per year, which could be recycled.

The world's annual consumption of plastic materials has increased from around 5 million tonnes in the 1950s to nearly 100 million tonnes today (WRAP).

About half of annual plastic production is destined for single-use products.

Recycling just one plastic bottle saves enough energy to power a 60W light bulb for six hours.

Did you know?

The ten major retailers use 810 thousand tonnes of single-use plastic in their products every year.



Only 57% of plastic bottles are recycled in the UK compared with 96% in Norway and 98.5% in Germany, where bottles carry a refundable deposit of 22p.

Every day around 15 million plastic bottles (5.5 billion a year) enter the UK waste stream after just one use.

It is estimated that some 1.2 million tonnes of plastic film from packaging arises in the UK waste stream every year. Of this, around two thirds are post-consumer (i.e. from household) and one third from commercial, industrial and agricultural sources.

The UK flushes 12.7 million tonnes of plastic into the oceans every year. This includes plastic bottles, bags, toiletries, microbeads and nurdles, which are the minute pellets that form the building blocks of plastic products.

Plastic can take up to 500 years to decompose.
