

HARBOROUGH DISTRICT COUNCIL AIR QUALITY ACTION PLAN

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1 Executive Summary

- 1.1 Under Part IV of the Environment Act 1995 there is a requirement for all Local Authorities to assess their local air quality and to predict future conditions against the National Air Quality Objectives.
- 1.2 The local review of air quality takes place over several phases. This Action
 Plan has been compiled as a result of the declaration of an Air Quality
 Management Area in Lutterworth Town Centre in July 2001.
- 1.3 The Action Plan should be read in conjunction with the Stage 4 Review and Assessment. Both documents have been compiled in accordance with the requirements of the DEFRA guidance TG (03) and policy guidance LAQM.PG (03).
- 1.4 The various identified options are being appraised and a comprehensive package of measures will be developed and implemented by the various organisations with the responsibility for carrying out the improvements.

2 Introduction

- 2.1 Under the Environment Act 1995, Harborough District Council has a duty to assess the existing local air quality and to predict future conditions against the National Air Quality Objectives.
- 2.2 The assessment of local air quality takes place over several stages and as a result of the Review and Assessment, completed in November 2000, an Air Quality Management Area was declared in Lutterworth Town Centre. A more detailed Stage 4 Review and Assessment was carried out and completed in March 2004. This report confirmed that it is unlikely that the National Air Quality Objectives for Nitrogen Dioxide are to be met. In addition, it was felt that the original Air Quality Management Area was an under estimation of the area in which the national objectives would not be met. In view of this it is proposed to extend the existing Air Quality Management Area to incorporate all the sensitive locations where it is felt that the air quality objective will not be met. The consultation of the Stage 4 document is currently being carried out.
- 2.3 The predicted levels of Nitrogen Dioxide within the extended Air Quality Management Area for 2005 have been estimated to be in the region of 50.79µg/m³. In order that the National Air Quality Objective of 40µg/m³ annual average will be met, the levels of nitrogen dioxide will have to be reduced by 10.79µg/m³ or 21.24%.
- 2.4 As part of the Stage 4 review and Assessment, a source apportionment exercise was carried out to identify the various contributions to the relevant pollutant. For Nitrogen Dioxide, the relevant sources could be road traffic, local background levels and industrial processes. This information can then be used to target the most appropriate action to reduce the pollutant levels.
- 2.5 As a result of carrying out this exercise, it was concluded that the highest percentage of Nitrogen Dioxide in 2005 would come from background

sources of which Harborough District Council will have little influence over. Of the remaining Nitrogen Dioxide levels, the primary source in Lutterworth will be from road traffic. In view of this any options considered in the Action Plan will address all forms of traffic, however it will aim to concentrate on the most polluting. No point sources or industrial process have been identified that would have a significant effect on the levels of Nitrogen Dioxide in the local area. Consequently no options related to emissions from point sources and industrial processes have been identified in the list of potential improvement measures.

- 2.6 In drawing up the Action Plan a number of existing policies/strategies have been identified which have identified air quality and/or transport as issues to be addressed. These include:
 - Leicestershire County Local Transport Plan
 - Leicestershire Community Strategy
 - Harborough District Council Community Strategy
 - Harborough District Council "The Improving Council" Corporate Plan 2004-2007
 - Harborough District Council Local Plans
- 2.7 In the Action Plan a number of options have been considered for the short, medium and long term period. Part of the consultation process will be to evaluate each of the options having regard to not only the possible improvements to the local air quality, but also the social and economic effect on the local population.
- 2.8 The aim of the consultation process will be to draw up a prioritised package of options that are likely to have the most significant effect to improve the air quality in Lutterworth Town Centre having regard to the social, economical and financial costs/benefits.
- 2.9 The range of options chosen may not result in the national objectives being reached by the target year of 2005, however annual progress report should demonstrate that any actions undertaken are working towards reaching these objectives.

3 Action Plan Options

3.1 A number of options have been identified that would have an influence on the local air quality. At this stage only approximate costs and timescales have been allocated to each option. In addition the options have not been prioritised in any order of preference or effectiveness. This work will be carried out as part of the Action Plan.

The responsibility of some of the agreed measures will be the responsibility of other organisations; however Harborough District Council will work with these organisations to influence the implementation of the Action Plan.
- 5.2 The annual Progress Report will monitor the effectiveness of the various measures to confirm that any actions taken are working towards achieving the National Air Quality Objectives.
