# News update Harborough

It has been another busy month for Harborough officers with some great results for us to share:

A Section 59 ticket (for driving in an anti social manner) was issued to a person causing anti social behaviour (ASB) by riding his motorbike around Coventry Road. This means if

he is found to be doing this again his bike can be taken away from him.

A prolific shoplifter in Market Harborough has been sentenced to 12 weeks in prison for two offences committed in the town centre.

A distraction burglar has been charged with a number of offences, they have pleaded guilty and have subsequently been remanded into custody awaiting sentencing.

A young person who threatened a man with a gun during a night out in Market Harborough has been sentenced to six months in prison.

They are sharing facilities in the first 'blue light co-location' scheme of its kind in Leicestershire.

Work has taken place in the car park to accommodate ambulance vehicles and internal building work has been undertaken to accommodate staff.
