During the first two weeks of November we received reports of antisocial behaviour and young people throwing fireworks in the street. Two people were arrested in connection with the incidents and have now been released on bail. The investigation is ongoing and officers would like to speak to anyone who had a firework thrown either at themselves, their vehicle or their property, and has not yet contacted police to come forward.

Recently our volunteers have been out doing speed monitoring checks in Kimcote and Frolesworth, with further checks happening across the area in the coming weeks. Please be mindful of your speed and stick to the speed limit. Throughout this month, across the whole force area, officers will also be clamping down on those suspected of driving while under the influence of drink or drugs. Drivers face random breath tests by patrolling officers and we would urge anyone to report it if they believe someone behind the wheel is impaired.

The wet weather that persisted throughout November led to a lot of flooding, closed roads and some very dangerous road conditions in the area. Please don't risk travelling through flooded roads – 'Road Closed' and 'Flood' signs are in place to warn you. Please plan your journey and allow extra time.

We have increased reassurance patrols and policing presences in the Lutterworth and Broughton Astley area and would encourage residents who see us out and about to talk to us and raise any concerns they may have.

Take care of your belonging when out and about


In Lutterworth there have been a number of purse and bag thefts from trolleys in shops.

Please be careful while out shopping. Be vigilant about your bag - make sure it is always fastened or zipped up. Don't leave it unattended on a shopping trolley and don't leave your bag in the car (unlocked) when you go to return your trolley.


Don't leave Christmas presents on view in your car.

Harborough District Council has provided purse bells and chains free of charge. These can be collected from Town Council offices and Waitrose and Morrisons in Lutterworth.

Darker nights — lights on



The nights are getting darker much earlier now and we urge you to always make sure that your home appears to be occupied. We often see an increase in burglaries during the winter night, with many taking place between 4pm and 7pm. Leave a light on or even better invest in a timer switch and set it to come on a couple of times a day. Burglars are more likely to target a home that is visibly unoccupied and in darkness so this will help to deter them.

Fraudsters claiming to be from Action Fraud

Watch out for fake emails claiming to be from Action Fraud
