Rough grass, encroaching scrub and trees, overgrown hedges to east boundary (with recreation ground and old paddocks); the basin itself has reedmace and other plants of periodically wet habitat.

At least 5 BAP species birds recorded.

Open access from footpath B5 and via undesignated path via footpath B1 and School Lane.

Recorded (Phase 1 Habitat Survey 2015) as wet and mesotrophic grassland of higher than local significance, assessed as potential **Local Wildlife Site** (pLWS).

Identified during consultation for this Plan as a potential community/wildlife asset whose biodiversity and community value could be enhanced further by appropriate management.

Allotments and other land, with pond. Surviving fragment of early 19th century parkland associated with Kibworth Rectory, now in rear gardens of houses on Rectory Lane and on undeveloped area between them

Mapped as Priority Habitat (deciduous woodland) by Natural England. Locally significant for aquatic, grassland and woodland plants, invertebrates and vertebrates (amphibians, reptiles, birds, mammals).
